Deny access for specific tools at an approved supplier

If you use Skolon's **approved suppliers** feature, as an organisation administrator, you can specify if any particular tool should be **blocked from access**.

This means you can choose to approve a supplier even if not all of their tools can be approved, as you can control access at the tool level. Here's how to do it:

- Click **Data Visualisation** in "My apps."
- Click **Data Protection**.
- Search for or scroll to the supplier you intend to edit.
- Click on the relevant supplier.
- **Check the box** next to the tool you want to deny access to. Click **Reject**.
