To get a quick overview of the users at your school, classes / groups and tools at your school, follow this guide.

Click the **School Admin** icon in **My Collection**. You will find the amount of users, classes and groups at your school directly on the start page of the **School Admin tool**. Note that the a of tools refers to the total number of tools and includes local tools as well as built-in system tools, for example School admin.

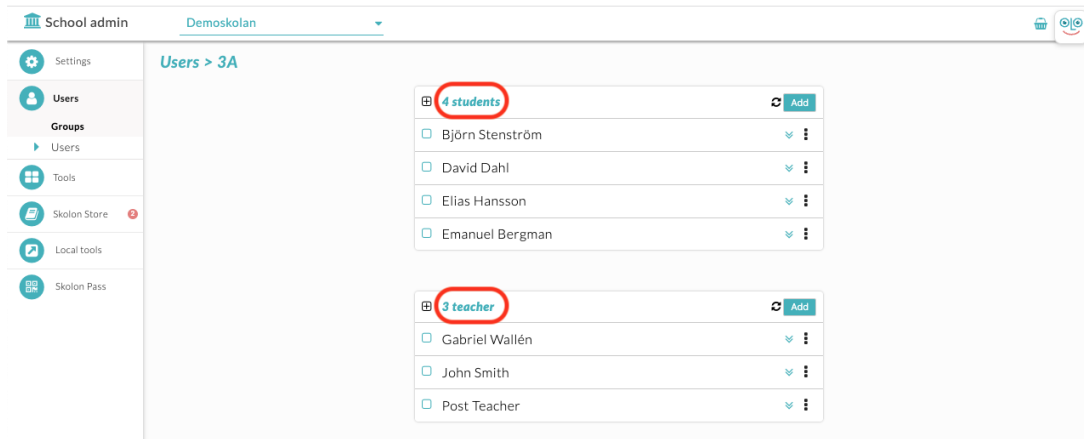
Members of classes / groups

If you want to check how many and which users are in a class or group. Click **Users**, and then click **Groups**. Then click on the Class designation. You can search for classes and groups or browse through the **Next page**. Classes are displayed at the top of the page and if you scroll down the page you will find Groups correspondingly.

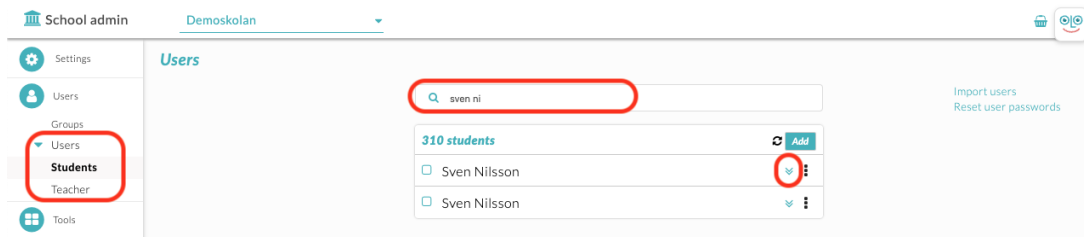
